I can get hold of vouchers from W.H.Smith, HMV (including Waterstone's),Dixons, Curry, PC World, The Link, Book Tokens, Homebase and High Street, which are valid in 70 high street stores including Boots, Mothercare, Iceland, Comet, Woolworth, Index, New Look, Peacocks, BHS and H.Samuel to name but a few.

I will be taking orders — with money up front — until 5 December. The vouchers are worth £5 each.

Last posting dates for this year are: Outside Europe — 6 December, Eastern Europe — 10

### SPRUCING UP

THE VILLAGE HALL
The six large windows have been replaced. They not only look good but have a feel-good factor in terms of added warmth in the hall. We are grateful for grants of £1,750, with the balance of £550 coming from village hall funds. We must also replace facia boards and curtain tracks, which brings us to the wish list! We have long appreciated that an extension to the back of the hall is needed for storage of equipment for the hall, Tiddley-winks, Brownies and Guides.

It is regrettable that it takes a Disability Discrimination Act to make the hall user-friendly to able-bodied and disabled people alike. Fortunately we have dealt with toilet facilities, but by 2004 other adjustments should have been assessed. Improvements to the external approach and entrance threshold, surfaces and levels are required. More cosmetic items are lever taps, entrance mats and contrasting colours around light-switches. Our priority will be for the car park area, entrance and fire exit, and possibly a hearing induction loop. We are advised that in the parking area a 1-in-20 gradient would be applicable.

Combining the extension building and car park landscaping would seem the best way forward, but the cost is somewhat daunting. A rough estimate for both projects is £25,000. We will be looking for 50% in grants, which still leaves a lot of fund-raising to do. For queries on any of the above please contact me on 851206. West
