## 140 YEARS AGO

December 18, 1862. Planted two of the yew trees in Upton churchyard, viz. in the N.W. corner and that on the left hand of entrance gates; two others planted, viz. that on right of entrance and that on S. side of church on the spot where Mrs Philip Humfrey's tree stood. (Evidently the first tree had not flourished.) Excerpt from the diary of the Reverend Richard Hooper, Upton's first vicar.
