At noon on Wednesday, 8th January 2003 Sheila's unadorned coffin was carried into St Mary's Church between lines of villagers and friends. This spontaneous gesture, along with the fact that 120 people squeezed into the tiny church, was a moving testament to the high esteem in which Sheila was held.

Everyone there represented some aspect of her full and busy life. The Rev'd Edwin Clements lead the service and paid tribute to Sheila. He spoke of how she and Doug had met at a dance, their life together first in Didcot and then in Upton, their two daughters, Sheila and Jill and the love and affection they had for their family and grandchildren. He told of Sheila's work at the village school and later at AERE. How she was Chairman of the Parish Council and treasurer of Upton Village Amenities Trust. Sheila had that great talent for making and retaining friends. She was known in the village for her involvement in so many activities which included fund-raising for improvement for Upton's benefit. How many remember the hours of babysitting she and Doug did to raise funds for the village hall? Many of those 'babies' were well represented at the funeral.

The unofficial guard of honour reassembled as Sheila's coffin was borne out of St Mary's

to the crematorium. Doug and his family invited everyone to join them at the village hall. Most accepted the invitation and a throng meet to exchanged memories of this popular, energetic lady. I found it very strange to be at an event in Upton Village Hall and not to see Sheila smiling from behind the teapot.

1 The meeting on 14 January began with one minute's silence in remembrance of Sheila Parker, who was the leader of Upton Parish Council for the past four years. Tracey Seelig was then elected chairman in her place, with Graham de Wilde as vice-chairman. At the end of the evening Richard Farrell, our County and District Councillor, expressed all our thoughts when he spoke of Sheila's diligence and tactful diplomacy and described her as 'the kindest and most considerate chairman one could ever hope to meet'.

1 PC Frame attended to discuss security matters. He reported that village hall windows and glass covering the notice board had been broken. CCTV would be too extreme a precaution, but an alarm and toughened glass were suggested. He said that a spate of garage thefts in Blewbury continues and he urges people to lock sheds and garages.
