MUGA news

The Parish Council has approved sending out tenders for the construction of the Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) on the recreation ground. This does not mean that we have the money in place, but it's the continuing process of providing necessary documentation to parties who might be prepared to put funds into the project.

The specification for tender, kindly done by Mark Yates, has estimated the cost to be about £45,000, which may seem a huge amount but spread over several funding groups this hopefully will be achievable. The work should take about eight weeks and we're planning for a start date of August 2003 to catch the dry weather, with a possible completion by the end of September or early October.

Whether this will actually occur is open to debate, but most funding organisations want a time framework so we have to put something reasonably realistic down. The tenders should be in by 12 April and Tony Durbin has kindly agreed to be project manager.

We have had a few financial contributions and if anyone does wish to make a donation this would be very welcome. Please deliver it either to myself, Tony Durbin or Carol Hall.

Another thing that would be very helpful — if anyone spots whilst reading newspapers or company magazines, or on the radio or television, items about groups that are offering funding to community projects such as ours, could they take down the details and pass it on to one of us to follow up.

That's it for now. We'll keep you posted on progress, oh and if anyone happens to win the lottery or inherits a fortune from a long-lost uncle could they please remember our little project! We believe it will do wonders for Upton.
