A BROADBAND SET-UP FEE BONUS

There is more good news about Upton's broadband internet access. The South East England Development Agency (SEEDA) have approved a grant of just under £14,000 to help pay the capital costs of our new wireless network. This in turn has enabled our supplier Invisible Networks to reduce everyone's set-up fee by £100 — so if you have ordered a Standard Service, you will now only pay a one-off charge of £99, including VAT, as well as the monthly usage fees. Similarly, the Premium setup fee will be £199, not £299. Please note that these prices will also apply to all new orders, now and in the future. So if you want high-speed internet and haven't yet got around to placing a pre-order, get on over to www.didcotring.uk.net and sign on the dotted today!
