## CHAIRMAN'S REPORT TO ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The Parish Council has changed little over the past two years. Ros Caffyn was co-opted in 2003 when a vacancy was left by the late Sheila Parker. In 2004 Yvonne Collins took over from Lynne Riordan as Clerk and Kathryn Fletcher replaced Margaret Abbot as Minor Authority Governor to Blewbury Primary School. Ros has recently decided to resign; we will be very sorry to lose her and are looking to fill the vacancy.

### Recreation ground

The grass cutting for this season has been awarded to a new contractor. Through the Vale Amenity Tree Planting scheme three trees have replaced young trees which died, and four indigenous trees have been planted along the entrance to Upton from Harwell. In the children's playground the rubber swing seats have been replaced and numerous palisades in the surrounding fence: an ongoing problem.

The PC Recreation Ground Development Committee has experienced mixed fortunes; construction of the Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA) was due to commence in August 2003 but grants were not forthcoming. The project was downsized and another round of applications set in motion. In April 2004 the PC pledged 5% of the total cost of the project up to £2,500 provided the rest could be secured from other sources. This was not made available indefinitely. Last autumn the Committee were offered £15,000 by WREN (Waste Recycling credits) and they are waiting to hear from another source. The PC will then review the project, although this money can only be used for the given purpose and within a specific time-scale.

### Parish Plan

Since 2003 the Steering Committee have been working tirelessly on the PC's behalf. Final questionnaires were delivered in November 2004 and collated answers were presented to the village in February; there is a great deal of support for a cycle track to Blewbury and for improved sports facilities on the recreation ground. Some clubs such as the Wine Tasting Group are already being set up. The Steering Group are currently producing a draft Plan for approval by the PC; once adopted, each household will receive a copy.

### Reading Road improvements

The PC and Parish Transport Representatives, Juliet and Peter Gardiner, met Ralph Green of Oxfordshire Highways Division (OCC) to discuss ideas for reducing traffic speed on the main road. Gateways, altered roadmarkings and pedestrian footway are complete.

### Bus Shelter

finished last September. It was a matter of days before offensive graffiti appeared. The PC is in the process of painting this out and coating the whole area with anti-graffiti laquer. We have also bought new seats from Upton Reclaim Timber.

### Burial Ground

The purchase of land for the new burial ground was completed at last in July 2004.

### Litter Picking

The litter pick in March organised by Mike Brown in conjunction with the VOWH was extremely successful. Thanks to numerous volunteers (some turning out on three separate occasions!) all roads, verges, ditches and banks within the parish were cleared of litter. My thanks also to Juliet and Peter Gardiner who are never without a carrier bag on their regular walks of the village footpaths.

### Website

Upton's website ([www.uptonvillage.co.uk](http://www.uptonvillage.co.uk)) became live in July 2004. It carries articles from the *Upton News* along with items submitted by parishioners. Many thanks to Piran Fletcher for single-handedly designing and maintaining this.

### Archives

Thanks to Carol Hall, the parish records were sifted, sorted and many were passed on permanent loan to the OCC Archive Office.

Finally, my thanks to my fellow Parish Councillors who are all volunteers and have been working very hard on your behalf. Thanks especially to Graham de Wilde and Mike Brown who have become the village handymen, can turn their hands to almost anything and in so doing have saved the parish a considerable amount of money! My thanks to the members of the Parish Council committees and the Parish Plan Steering Group and to all of you who have helped throughout the past year or who have offered help for the future. And last, but by no means least, my thanks to Yvonne Collins who has proved to be a very competent, efficient and hardworking Clerk.
