It is hoped that this article will become a regular feature of the Newsletter so that everyone is more aware of what the Parish Council is doing within the Village.

During the last few weeks, Councillors have ploughed through the ever increasing amount of paperwork, attended meetings on transport issues, planning issues, etc. We have cleaned up the bus shelter, installed new seats,

repainted it where necessary and covered the walls with anti-graffiti lacquer. We have also replaced several missing fencing panels in the playground (a never ending task), cut back overhanging shrubs and, rather than wait for OCC to repair the Pound Lane road sign, we have done it ourselves. With some volunteer helpers, Councillors have been very busy preparing the new area of burial ground; tree stumps have been removed, the ground sprayed, ploughed and seeded. It has now been fenced and a gate has been installed. Mr and Mrs Gardiner (our Parish Transport representatives) are continually monitoring the condition of Upton's network of footpaths and they report back to the Parish Council at every meeting.

At the last Parish Council meeting the Multi-Use-Games-Area (MUGA) Committee reported that, as they had been unable to secure sufficient funding, the project was unable to proceed. Whilst it was agreed that the recreation ground was in need of improvement, it was decided that no further action would be taken until the Parish Plan Steering Committee were able to give a clear picture of what the Village would like to see.

## From the Rector

I shall be celebrating a significant milestone in my ministry this month, because twenty five years ago, on 29 June 1980, I was ordained priest in Christchurch Cathedral by the Bishop of Oxford. Then followed my first celebration of the Holy Eucharist on 1 July at St. Peter's Didcot, where I was serving my first curacy.

In order to mark this occasion, I shall celebrate at St. Andrew's on **Wednesday 29 June at 7.30pm**. I have asked the Archdeacon of Berkshire to preach for this service because I have known him since I was first ordained. In those days he was Rector of Harwell and Chilton, and therefore a neighbour.

Apart from a five year sojourn in the Exeter diocese, I have spent the whole of my ministry in this area and am looking forward to sharing this anniversary with so many friends. I have organised a buffet after the service at Hagbourne School to which you are warmly invited.

There are many privileges that go with the ordained priesthood, the greatest of which must be to preside at the Holy Eucharist. This I have done many, many times and it has been a great source of strength for all those years. I have also been blessed with a variety of ordained colleagues during my twenty five years, but none as special as the ones who work with me now.

It also goes, almost without saying, that I have never enjoyed such outstanding and valuable lay colleague as those who exercise

their considerable gifts of ministry in the Benefice today. A further privilege in a priest's ministry is to have opportunities to minister at very deep levels to parishioners and I am always conscious that this is a special gift from God.

I realise that 25 years is not a great length of time and many priests are able to celebrate 40, 50 or even 60 years of ministry. But, having entered Holy Orders rather late in life, at the age of 38, this is likely to be the most significant anniversary for me. I therefore hope you will be able to join me on the 29th.

## VILLAGE HALL AWARD

At this month's AGM of the Upton Village Hall Amenities Trust (UVHAT) it was announced that plans are being made to provide improved access to the hall for disabled people and to build an extension which will include a new store and a small room for village records. The store is needed because the cupboard currently used by the Guides, Brownies and After School Club is quite inadequate and games equipment has to be stored elsewhere. Furthermore, the chairs and tables have to be kept in the main hall and this makes it very difficult for cleaners and hall users who require the space.

Over £5000 has been raised in the past two years through voluntary work and special efforts; two generous individuals have given a further £1250; and early this month a grant of £5000 was received from Awards for All.

As a result the Trust will shortly be able to let a contract to build the improved access facilities. It has also begun to accumulate the funds needed for the extension.

The work of raising money and seeking further grants from official bodies and private trusts continues. The recent car boot sale yielded nearly £300. **The next fund raising event will be the Open Gardens on Sunday 26 June.**
