## Tom Webber - Deceased

Villagers who recollect less sophisticated and technological times may recall with pleasure the wonderful slide shows which Tom used to give. He travelled widely, often adventurously, and took stunning photographs.

They may therefore be sad to know that he has recently died in a nursing home in Teignmouth.

He lived in "Fernwood" on the High Street for many years and worked at Harwell till his retirement. His accent always betrayed his West Country origins and he moved to Devon to be nearer to members of his family. In Upton, he was a stalwart member of the Methodist Church, given the responsibility of auctioning the produce after the old-style Harvest Suppers.

And because of his wide range of interests, not least in film and theatre, he was a ready and good-humoured conversationalist, often over the garden fence. He had enjoyed walking and swimming, but as his health deteriorated his friends here had virtually lost contact with him. Very recently, however, one of his cousins wrote to say that he would still enjoy hearing from us, even if he was unable to reply. Soon after we had resumed correspondence we heard news of his death.

## Tea with Alice, a world of Wonderland illustration

The Alice books have been translated into more than 100 languages and interpreted by countless illustrators, artists and designers. This exhibition of contemporary illustrators reveals the new golden age of Alice illustration and how Carroll's famous stories have inspired images across the world. Illustrators include the former Children's Laureate, Anthony Browne, as well as Dusan Kallay from Slovakia and Chiara Carrer from Italy. A chance to see it, read it, be it: try on the hats, visit the mad tea party, enjoy riddles and relax in the Read Me room and browse different versions of the stories.

## Rochester's Extraordinary Story Loom

The fabulous story of Barnabas Rochester's only surviving story manufacturing machine. Victorian inventor Barnabas Rochester had an interest in stories but little talent for writing them - which is why he is said to have built the Storyloom. But could a machine be any match for a pen, paper and human imagination when it came to making stories? Is the Storyloom a marvel of Victorian genius or pure humbug?

Experiment with the only surviving story manufacturing machine - discovered and reassembled at The Story Museum - and see for yourself.

## Rectors Reflections

### *How Much Is Enough?*

Recently, I have had several conversations with people, churchgoers and no-churchgoers alike, on the subject of faith. Some people have been troubled because they feel that they don't have enough faith to be considered a Christian. This has raised an interesting question: how much faith is enough? And it also raises another question-what do we mean by faith? It's easy for us to get a wrong sense of what faith really is. Faith is basically a positive response to God. For a Christian, faith is the willingness to say something like this "Ok, God, you're real. You're something to do with Jesus, and Jesus is something to do with you. There's lots I don't understand but I'm prepared to be open to learn more. Sometimes I'll be angry at you; sometimes I'll think you're completely amazing; and sometimes I won't know what to think. But I know that I'll try to keep up a relationship with you, because somehow this seems to make sense of my life and my world."

It is quite normal for the strength of this positive response to God to vary, even for a regular churchgoer. There are times when God feels very real, and times when he seems to have disappeared - times when you're sure God is there, and times when you're not quite sure! Furthermore, we shouldn't assume that faith is incompatible with doubt. In fact, for some people, faith is precisely what it is that



allows us to engage with our doubts - it is the supportive framework which allows doubts to be acknowledged and questions asked. The

Bible contains a story about a father who was worried about his son, who was suffering from convulsions. The father came to Jesus, to ask for Jesus' help. The father's faith in Jesus was a bit uncertain - he said "I believe", but added immediately, "Help my unbelief"! Interestingly, the father's honest expression of doubt did not prevent Jesus from working a miracle of healing.

So if we ask "how much faith is enough?", I would say that the answer is: much less than we might have thought. God has no problems with people who are honest about their doubts. And like the father who approached Jesus on behalf of his sick son, we can always say "I believe... Help my unbelief!"

## **Recipe of the Month**

### ***Artichoke Dip***

This is a really simple recipe that can be made at short notice out of the store cupboard. Gluten free and low carb. Good with tortilla chips, breadsticks or crudités.

Ingredients

- 1 can artichoke hearts, drained really well
- 2 cloves garlic
- ½ tsp ground cumin
- 2 tbsp good olive oil
- Freshly ground black pepper
- Salt to taste if required

Method

1. Puree the drained artichoke hearts with the garlic and the cumin until well mixed and then add 1½ tbsps of the olive oil and puree until really smooth and creamy.
2. Add the freshly ground black pepper to taste.
3. Finally drizzle the remaining oil over the top just before serving.

## ***Neighbourhood Watch***

If someone else offers to take your rubbish away to get rid of it, whether you pay them or not, you need to make sure you know where it's going and that the person taking it away has a licence to carry waste. You can check that they have a Waste Carrier's Licence on the Environment Agency website:

If your rubbish ends up being fly-tipped you could end up being interviewed under caution and later prosecuted. Take down a few details such as registration number, ideally take a photo and make a note of what is being taken away, get a receipt and check that their details are on it, which could help with any potential fly-tipping investigation, and help to show you complied with the law.

The rain stayed away, allowing for a fantastic afternoon's relaxation after very arduous conditions on the trail of either 45, 25 or 12 miles.
