## TV Digital Switchover

Oxfordshire will begin switching to digital-only TV on 14 September 2011. The two-stage process will complete two weeks later on 28 September. This means the existing analogue TV signal will be switched off and replaced with a new, stronger digital TV signal.

Switchover is happening so that Freeview services (digital TV through an aerial) can be extended to people who can't currently get them. Any analogue television left unconverted will no longer be able to receive TV

programmes after the switchover. If you already have Freeview, you will need to re-tune your TV on the day of switchover.

Oxfordshire Rural Community Council will be running advice points at the Cornerstone in Didcot to help with any questions you have about switchover, including re-tuning, equipment and the Switchover Help Scheme. **10am to 4pm on 14th, 15th, 28th and 29th September.**

## Recipe of the month

### *Luscious Apple Cake - serves 8*

This cake has no refined sugar - the sweetness comes from the dates and apples which make it deliciously moist.

Cooking time: 45 minutes + cooling  
Grease an 8" x 2½" deep round cake tin and line with parchment.

Preheat oven to 180 degrees/Gas 4.

Ingredients:

- 225g soft butter or pure sunflower spread
- 225g soft dates, de-stoned and roughly chopped
- 550g Bramley apples (unpeeled weight), cored and roughly chopped
- 112g white bread flour (Doves gluten-free white bread flour can also be used)
- 112g ground almonds
- 3 level tsp cream of tartar
- 1½ tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 5 medium eggs, lightly beaten



Method:

Blend the butter or spread with the dates and apples in a food processor. Transfer to a bowl. In another bowl, mix the flour, almonds, cream of tartar and bicarb of soda. Mix half of the egg into the apple mixture and then add half of the flour mixture. Repeat so all the ingredients are combined. Spoon into the tin and bake for 45 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the cake comes out clean. Cool slightly in the tin and then turn out and transfer to cool on a rack before slicing.

# Regional Neighbourhood Watch Report

Raves and rural crime are still a priority concern; hi-visibility patrols by Police and Police Community Support Officers are carried out at beauty spots, the Ridgeway, rural locations including outbuildings, to prevent illegal raves, burglaries and the theft of plant machinery and diesel. There has been an increase of theft from vehicles, particularly from beauty spots in the South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse areas. With the warmer weather more people are going out to rural locations for walks and leaving valuable items in their vehicles. Do not leave anything on display in your

vehicle; items stolen have included bags, Sat Nav's and mobile phones. Speeding is also a priority and locations have been identified where motorists regularly exceed speed limits, causing concern amongst residents. The Police Community Support Officers are carrying out speed checks in villages with the Speed Indication Device and the Automatic Number Plate Recognition machine. Owners of vehicles found to be exceeding the speed limit will be contacted. Their details are taken and logged on the police database.

There will be an extraordinary Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 2 August at 8.00 p.m. to discuss planning application UPT/11/01364/FUL proposed 2 storey house in Wattle Cottage field (next to George & Dragon).

### Planning Application No UPT/10932/3 11/01093/FUL

Fieldside House, ground floor cloakroom with shower. The PC had no objections & the Vale have permitted this application subject to compliance with conditions.

### Planning Application No UPT/16188/1

Brookside, High Street, new single and 2 storey extension and demolition of existing double garage, and conservatory. The PC had no objections to this application but requested that the Vale took into account that the extension could possibly deprive the neighbouring property of some light & attention should be given to the tree with a TPO in the garden of the Old Forge. The Vale permitted this development subject to compliance with conditions.
