Parish Council

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday 13th March at 8-00 in the Village Hall. Topics of interest will be Upton Roads (see below) and the ongoing improvements to our recreational amenities.

Planning Applications

UPT/1972/3 – Extensions and alterations to Village Hall – permitted

UPT/7108/2 – Erection of 4 bedroom chalet bungalow with double garage, Ravello – permitted with conditions.

UPT/ 12510/1- Re-siting of domestic oil tank at Icknield House, Chilton Road. – ongoing, the P.C. has no objections.

Upton Roads

After months of trying the P.C. has managed to drag out of the Highways Dept their intentions for re-surfacing our village roads this spring/summer. In March, Station Road and Pound Lane will be treated with a slurry surface, we have inspected similar treatments on roads in Harwell and have no objections to this work. During the summer months it is intended that High Street, Church Street and Stream Road will be treated with a summer dressing which is the process where the road is covered in tar and then stones are spread over the tar. You will all have seen the results of this treatment where initially many of the stones remain loose and given time and a few hot days some of the remaining stones particularly on slopes and corners are removed by the traffic leaving patches of tar. Your P.C. has written to the Highways Dept stating that this treatment is not acceptable in this village where our roads are also our pavements. We are awaiting a reply.

Litter Pick

Our annual litter pick will be on Sat. 24th March meeting at the village hall at 9-30.

Gloves and grabs will be provided as will yellow vests for those working on the verges of the busier roads. Please come along and help out if you can, we will reward you with a cup of tea and a biscuit but much greater reward is seeing our parish and particularly our roadside verges free of litter.

Final Meeting

The meeting this month will be the last for our present council. At the moment we have 6 members 5 of whom have come to the end of their term of office. If you would like to become a member of the council for the next 3 years

please contact our Parish Clerk for further details. If more than 5 nominations are submitted an election will be held on May 3rd.
