Our first Summer produce show in Upton in July was truly wonderful, thank you to the villagers who came over from Blewbury and also thanks to Upton villagers who were so welcoming! Our Autumn show is in Blewbury school hall on the 8th September, traditionally the autumn show is smaller and less frenetic, but recently we are seeing an increase in entries, global warming to blame perhaps, however, this year we are holding a tomato festival alongside the usual exhibits. Villagers have been given 10 seeds from about 40 different varieties of tomato, they have grown and nurtured carefully these little gems, there are varying types and cultivars, different colours shapes and sizes. I have stripy tomatoes, also slightly fuzzy tomatoes; some look like bananas, orange, yellow, red and giant ones which promise to be huge, who knows what will turn up? Meeting the Judges

Graham de Wilde, Belinda Drew and Ben Shaw ioined representatives of other Oxfordshire villages on Saturday the 18th August to present Upton Village to the judges of the Calor Oxfordshire Villages of the Year Competition. The invitation to the judging event at Kennington Village Hall to display materials that reflect the character of the village and to talk to the judges was given to Upton after being chosen as one of 18 finalists of the competition. The judges were looking for active, caring and inclusive communities, rewarding community action and community spirit. Ben, Belinda and Graham all had the opportunity to talk to the judges about the widespread involvement in village clubs and activities since the completion of the Parish Plan, to show off the excellent village website and to talk about the plans on the horizon such as village carbon emissions reduction.

The judging went very well, with the great success of Upton's Parish Plan attracting the attention of the judges and the Oxfordshire Rural Community Council (ORCC), leading to an invitation for a member of the village to speak on the subject at a Parish Plan training event in October.

Whichever community emerges as the Calor Oxfordshire Villages of the Year winner will have the honour of being nominated to go forward to represent the county in the prestigious Calor Village of the Year for England competition 2007/08. This will give them the opportunity to gain national recognition as well as a share of a prize fund totalling more than £36,000.
