Planning

Despite objections from the Parish Council and from just about all of the local residents outline planning permission has been granted for the demolition of 'Hitherto' and the erection of two -2 storey dwellings.

Neighbourhood Watch

The service is free and very well run locally by Celia Davies with messages coming up on your computer about once a month. Transport Help

It is now almost 2 years since we published our Parish Plan and over the next few months I will revisit some of the areas the Plan covered to see if circumstances have changed.

When the Questionnaires were completed we found that we had over 30 parishioners prepared to help out in taking people to medical and other appointments but at that time only two residents suggested they might need lifts. As a result we set up a very informal arrangement whereby those in need give either Clare Lightfoot or myself a call a few days in advance and we arrange a driver. To date the demand has been so low that we have done all the driving between us.

If your circumstances have changed or if you have joined us in the last two years and need transport to help you keep an appointment please give one of us a call. Mike 850135 or Clare 850486. If the demand has significantly increased we will look to set up a more formal organisation.

Oxfordshire County Council's trading standards and fire and rescue services have teamed up with Npower to provide free electric blanket tests in Wantage and other areas of Oxfordshire.


Finally, an event to look forward to for next month is the Christmas Fair which will be 2-4pm Friday 7th December - more details next month!
