PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council held a meeting on Tuesday 13th Nov. The minutes can be seen on the Notice Board or the village website or at the Post Office.

Trim Trail

At last year's annual parish meeting it was agreed to accept the proposal for improving the Recreation Ground that included the construction of a Trim Trail (a running track with a series of exercise stations spaced around it). Provisional estimates suggest the average cost for the minimum of 3-4 exercise stations will be £900 each. The proposal is that it should be an all-weather running track probably surfaced with bark, which if it is to be laid by a contractor is likely to take the total cost up to about £8000.

Your council is having doubts about taking this idea forward for several reasons.

We are concerned that bark is not suitable, it will be picked up by the mower as well as being spread onto the grass by the birds and particularly by the many rabbits in the area. Alternatives are likely to add considerably to the cost.

We are concerned that the construction of a track and the stations will add to the problem of mowing and maintaining the area.

We are concerned that there will be insufficient demand for the facility from the village to justify the outlay of the cost, a significant part of which will have to come from council funds, or to back up an application for external funding.

If you are a potential user of the facility please would you spare a moment to make me aware of your thoughts, if it is just a running track that would be useful we will be happy to mark out and maintain a grass track with almost immediate effect.

Grass Cutting

We have had some issues with the quality of the mowing contract this year. The cost of contracting out is significant, currently at £1400. The council is considering purchasing a ride-on mower for the main ground and a self propelled mower for the play area and seeking volunteers to operate them. This should provide considerable future cost benefits as well as enabling us to cut the grass when it is required

but it does depend on us getting the assistance of a group of volunteers.

Please would you be prepared to give us just over 2 hours of your time 3 or 4 times a year to have the pleasure of driving around the ground, or, if you don't fancy the ride-on bit please would you be able to offer similar time helping maintain the play area using a smaller mower. All equipment will be provided, no strenuous effort required, both jobs equally suited to male and female residents. If you are prepared to help please let me know.
