PARISH COUNCIL

Litter Pick

We managed to find the normal 40 sacks of rubbish with a small increase in the number of Vodka bottles from 83 to 100.

Parish Meeting

The annual village meeting will be held on Tuesday 8th April in the Village Hall. Drinks and nibbles will be available at 7.45 with the meeting starting at 8.00pm.

Please come along and take the opportunity to question your County and District Councillors and put forward your ideas of what you would like your parish council to be doing in the coming 12 months. Proposed plans for the extension to the village hall will be displayed and explained and the fund raising initiative to raise over £100,000 to pay for the extension will be discussed.

Please note that this year it is intended to make the meeting almost entirely interactive with reports on what has already happened being kept to a minimum, most of the formal reports that are required will be on display for you to read before the meeting starts.

Recreation Ground

Please be aware that the fence at the far end of the Recreation Ground will be repaired in the next two weeks thus preventing people from walking across the small field that goes down to the bridge. This field is private property and entry to the field has to be stopped off.

Mr de Wilde who owns the adjacent part of the disused railway line has kindly agreed that walkers may exit the far side of the Recreation Ground and use a path through his land to join up with the cycle-path. A stile will be erected in the corner of the Rec. to prevent motorcyclists using the path.

Please show consideration to these changes which your Parish Council have to make and please note that the path to the cycle-way will be closed for one day each year to prevent it from becoming an established Right of Way.

Snippets from Your School

The spring terms have been busy ones at Blewbury School, with exciting curriculum, sports, cultural and healthy living activities. The art, history, sports and theatre of the Ancient Greeks have been the theme for the Key Stage 2 classes (7-11 year olds). This has inspired some very creative writing based on Greek myths, notably from some of our more reluctant writers. The Food theme for Key Stage 1 led to some wonderful Design and Technology work on pizza packaging from the younger children. Our youngest pupils in Class 1 helped raise money for equipment for their classroom with a Sponsored bike ride.

We've also had plenty of sporting success this term. Our Girls Football Team were runners-up in the county finals in January, in February the school team won first place in the inaugural Didcot primary schools cross country competition held at South Moreton, and in March we won at netball and football.

In March we hosted visitors from around the world. First, children and teachers from our partner Comenius schools around Europe came for a four day visit, staying with host families in Blewbury and Upton. Comenius is a EU and British Council funded project that enable staff and pupils at a school to work together with partner schools on cross-curricular projects. Next there came teachers from our link school in Butagaya, Uganda. Pupils, staff and parents have been involved in fund raising for basic facilities for this very large rural school.
