PARISH COUNCIL

Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting for Upton was held in the Village Hall on 8th April, 20 parishioners attended.

Reports were given by the County Councillor, the District Councillor and by the Chairman of the Parish Council with Q and A sessions following each report.

Other reports were received and made available from Neighbourhood Watch, Blewbury School Governors, Parish Transport and Footpaths Representative, St Mary's Parochial Church Council and the United Charities for Local Parishes.

The Plans for the extension of the Village Hall were tabled and discussed as well as the proposals for raising the necessary finance. In his closing remarks the Chairman of the Parish Council thanked the other members of the council and the Parish Clerk for their efforts during the past year. He also thanked all those who had provided the annual reports for the meeting and a host of other parishioners who have done and are doing so much to make the life of their neighbours and other members of the community more pleasurable. In particular he paid tribute to Jessie and Tony West for all the work they do both for the Church and for the Village Hall and to Peter and Juliet Gardiner for their work on the Transport Committee and for their efforts in keeping the village and its footpaths free of litter.

ARTWEEKS

The South Oxfordshire area launches the festival this year with open studios and exhibitions from Sat. 3rd May to Sun. 11th May. Opening times are 12 to 6pm, with some sites opening late on Thursdays until 8pm. Check individual opening times with the free Artweeks guide, obtainable from tourist information, libraries, Savages and Upton & Blewbury post offices. The guide can also be viewed and

downloaded at www.artweeks.org . Joan Durbin has produced an A4 art trail map of open studios covering 7 sites from Chilton, Upton, West Hagbourne, Didcot, East Hagbourne and Blewbury. Copies can be picked up from participating sites, of which there are several in the immediate area, covering a range of media. Upton has 2 sites, with Joan Durbin exhibiting about 40 paintings in acrylic, watercolour and pastel, as well as artist's cards for sale. Please note her studio is closed on the Tues. Wed. and Thurs. this year. Sidney Hardwick has pottery, including her wash hand basins. The Vale and Downland museum in Wantage has a nonselling "South Area Taster Exhibition" from 29th April to 9th May, where you can see examples of the mixed work from about 28 exhibiting artists. There will be sculpture, textiles, jewellery, stained glass, ceramics as well as paintings.

Many of you will know that the size of our village hall restricts the use that can be made of it and that proposals for improvements form part of the Village Plan. Several of the groups using the hall would welcome the extra space. It would also allow for additional activities to be introduced – such as short mat bowls.

Plans have now been approved and the total cost is likely to be about £114.000.

The good news is that most of this can probably be met from money already set aside and grants from local authorities and other bodies. However, we will need to raise *more money locally* if we are to have sufficient to go ahead.

Within the next fortnight we will be sending a letter to each household in the village explaining the situation and *encouraging involvement in bringing this scheme to fruition*.

WINE CLUB

The Wines of Bordeaux by Simon Powell

The wine club met again on the 16th of April, the presentation was by one of our very own, the knowledgeable Simon Powell, presenting a small tour, on the Wines of Bordeaux. As usual the assembled gathering waited in anticipation, for the first glass and always sad to see the last glass.

We tasted 9 wines, 3 whites and 6 reds, all of them available from the Wine Society and all of them interesting. The Bordeaux region consists of 4 main areas from the Medoc and Graves on the left bank, Entre-Deux -Mer, and Pomerol on the right bank, thus we were able to compare the various areas. The reds where mainly a blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, and Merlot, the more Merlot the less tannin, and depending on individual taste, people decided on their favourite.

The evening progressed well and as usual everyone enjoyed themselves, the nice experience of this evening was that we were able to taste some very expensive wines which many of us would perhaps not risk raiding the piggy bank for, a very enlightening experience. Simon posed an interesting question would you pay £26 for a wine from an exclusive vineyard in Bordeaux or would you be happier with a less expensive red from say Chile or Argentina, possessing very similar qualities? Individuals make their own choices. My personal favourite being the last wine, the Sauterne, absolutely stunning.

Thanks again to Simon for a wonderful evening and raising some very interesting questions.
