RECTORS REFLECTIONS

Carol Singers from Mars

Well, it's that time of year again. Mince pies, carols, cards, and good will to all! There are so many wonderful things associated with



Christmas. Every year we insist on marking the season, and end up doing all sorts of Christmassy things – or wish we were doing all sorts of Christmassy things, if only we had a bit more money, or if only our minds did not dwell on Christmases past, enjoyed with loved ones who are no longer with us. But among all this seasonal activity, I wonder whether we ever give ourselves the opportunity to ponder what it's all about. If a bunch of Martian carol singers rang your doorbell one evening and asked you to explain the meaning of Christmas, what would you say?

It would certainly be a challenge. So let me suggest an answer to give to those inquisitive Martians. Christmas is above all, about hope. Hope placed not in fallible human beings, but hope placed in God's all powerful and never changing love for us and for all His creation. We hear about this hope in the bible readings read at carol services, and in the words of the carols themselves. We share this hope when we light candles, and let their light shine in the darkness.

Christmas is about hope because Jesus is about hope. The fact that God decided to take human flesh and live as one of us shows us how much he cares for us. It also means that God understands what it means to be a human being. He understands human life from the inside, with all its complexities and all its simplicities, with all its joys and with all its sorrows. As human

beings, we should never let ourselves think that God doesn't care, or that God doesn't understand. If that were the case, why would God have bothered to live a human life, confined by the constraints of time and space, amid the dirt and poverty of First Century Palestine? Life would have been so much nicer for Him if He had stayed put in Heaven.

The birth of Jesus was just the beginning of a new unfolding of God's gift of hope. For through Jesus' death and resurrection, we have been given the hope of peace with God, and a new life, eternal life. This eternal life can be grasped in part in the life we lead here on earth, but we can only experience it in all its fullness after we die. Sometime in the future, at a time of God's own choosing, the gift of hope, which began with Jesus' birth, will have come to its full fruition. There will be nothing more to hope for, because the whole of the Universe will know God's love, joy and peace in all their fullness.

So hope is what it's all about, hope in God's love for us, hope made visible in a baby in a manger, hope made audible in a baby's cries...And if you do happen to meet some Martians, do invite them to our carol services – I hear that Martians enjoy a good sing, especially at this time of year. They are also partial to the odd mince pie.

BLEWBURY SCHOOL Schools International Eco Charter

In October, as part of the Comenius Life Learning Project (funded by the British Council), six pupils from Blewbury School travelled to South West France where they were joined by pupils from France, Sweden, Poland and the Czech Republic.

The Comenius project's aim is to promote cohesion and understanding between European countries. This year the children met to present ideas of actions that could be made to help make our world more sustainable. Each country presented five ideas which the children discussed, questioned and ranked in order of importance. They then very democratically decided on the five agreed aims to take back to all the schools. They wanted to harvest water, cut down on wastage of paper, recycle a greater variety of materials, waste less food in dining halls and wear warmer clothes before turning up the heating.

We will all work on these and see if they make a difference to our energy usage.
