Parish Transport Representative

The Parish Council is looking for a volunteer to take on the role of Parish Transport Representative or someone who is prepared to assist the P.C. in monitoring the bus service and supplying the council with figures on usage and performance.

It is essential if we are to maintain our present level of bus service that we make ourselves heard in areas where decisions are made.

Parish Precept

For the year starting April 2009 the council has decided to keep its precept (the amount of your council tax that comes back to your parish) at £7250. This will be the fourth year at this level. The cost to the average household will be 85P per week.

Grass Cutting

I know it is not the time of year for thinking of grass cutting but it is only about 6 weeks away. As you will be aware, last year we had a team of 12 volunteers who did a superb job keeping the grass cut in the recreation ground and the children's play area. If you can spare 3 sessions of about 3 hours during the summer and would be prepared to join the team I will be delighted to hear from you.

Litter

The annual parish litter pick will take place on 28th March meeting at the village hall at 9.30 for a cup of tea and a biscuit before we set off. Grabs, gloves and florescent vests will be provided.

NAG Meeting

On Monday 19th January 2009 I attended the quarterly Police Neighbourhood Action Group meeting at Milton Park. The main topic of discussion was the SID machine frequently seen in operation in our surrounding villages. Residents may be interested to know that in the last quarter it was used for a total of 8 hrs in Upton and out of 961 cars a total of 36 drivers were exceeding the 30 mph speed limit driving through our village.

Apart from Rowstock and Blewbury we had the highest number of "hits" on the machine. We are likely to see even more of this valuable machine on the A417 and Chilton Road during the coming weeks.

YOUNG ACHIEVERS

Alex Murphy, aged13, took up swimming to support his training for his black belt in Karate at age 11.

He and his brother joined a new swim club at the Wave in Didcot and it was the coach, Iryna Kobzar, who realised Alex had potential. In his first season Alex made Counties and Regionals and was 1.9 seconds off a National qualifying time. Last summer the family holiday was skipped so Alex could train everyday and in the Autumn he was rightly rewarded with a National Qualifying time of 1.11.22 seconds for 100m breaststroke.

He has been selected for the County team (Oxford and North Bucks) on 3 occasions. Last October he attended the Inter County Nationals at Pond's Forge, Sheffield, where he won the only Gold for the team. He was selected for the English Schools Swimming Association (ESSA) Division 10 and represented King Alfred's in Enfield. He qualified for the Winter Championships held in Aldershot Garrison Pool and broke the record for 50m breaststroke in his age group (34.30 secs.). He was for a while ranked number one nationally for his 100 breaststroke. He swam breaststroke for the City of Oxford SC in the National (Speedo) League – they were promoted to the Premier Division. In January, this year, he competed in the Dragon Meet at the National Pool, Swansea over 3 days, having qualified for 6 events. He made 3 finals and gained 2 Golds, again in breaststroke, the 100m (new Pb – personal best, of 1.10.80) and 200m (2.41.86). He has qualified for the Counties Championships in 13 events, this March. He has the Regionals at the end of May and the Nationals in July. He continues to train 4 mornings before school and 3 evenings a week totaling 10/12 hours. Weekends are often taken

BLEWBURY SCHOOL

Christmas and the 'Big Build'

During the run up to Christmas Blewbury Primary School was full of buzz and excitement. The younger students demonstrated their own understanding of Christmas through a highly successful production of Born in a Barn and all the classes were involved in singing carols and songs that were recorded for a whole school CD. I am sure that many a grandparent's Christmas stocking was filled with a copy of this.

As part of the Creative Partnership Project, children from Blewbury, Hagbourne and Harwell schools focused on architecture with reference to science and sustainability. Architects and artists were interviewed by the children and subsequently worked with them on a number of schemes that culminated in the 'Big Build'. This involved designing and producing class shelters from plastic plumbing poles and scrap plastic sheeting, velcro and tape with the help of the architects who taught skills of joining and structure creation, and the visual artist who held a workshop to study light, shadows, colour and space. The final structure created a space big enough to accommodate all of the students. This exciting project widened the horizons of the children and enhanced not only practical skills but also self-confidence and collaborative group work.

As a parent, as well as a governor, I am convinced that Blewbury School is an innovative environment for children. 2009 will, I am sure, be another successful year for the school.
