The other day someone shared the following poem with me and it has certainly got me

thinking. The poem was written by George Herbert, and speaks of God's love for each one of us.

You probably already know all about... **George Herbert** (3 April 1593 – 1 March 1633) a Welsh poet and Anglican priest. As a student at Trinity College, Cambridge, England, George Herbert excelled in languages and music.

In 1630, in his late thirties he gave up his secular ambitions and took holy orders in the Church of England, spending the rest of his life as a rector of the little parish of Fugglestone St Peter with Bemerton St Andrew, near Salisbury.

Love bade me welcome: yet my soul drew back,
Guilty of dust and sin.
But quick-ey'd Love, observing me grow slack,
From my first entrance in,
Drew nearer to me, sweetly questioning,
If I lack'd anything.

A guest, I answer'd, worthy to be here:
Love said, You shall be he.
I the unkind, ungrateful? Ah my dear,
I cannot look on thee.
Love took my hand, and smiling did reply,
Who made the eyes but I?

Truth Lord, but I have marr'd them: let my shame

Go where it doth deserve.

And know you not, says Love, who bore the blame?

My dear, then I will serve. You must sit down, says Love, and taste my meat: So I did sit and eat.

It is comforting to know that God always welcomes us with open arms, however we are feeling about ourselves, or about God!
