RECTORS REFLECTIONS



Running The Risk Of Resurrection

Over the last few weeks, I have had several conversations with

people about the world of work. More particularly, the conversations have looked at the question of changing career, perhaps with a view to doing something completely different. In one case, someone was about to be made unemployed, and this has prompted the question. In another case, there was a sense of dissatisfaction with an existing job - there was a feeling that there must be something more to life, but what?

These conversations bring to my mind something that Jesus said:

"...those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will save it. What does it profit them if they gain the whole world, but lose or forfeit themselves?"

Sometimes we have a particular view of who we are as persons, and we struggle long and hard to maintain that view. We are desperate to save our life as we know it, and we cannot imagine anything different. It might be that this image of ourselves involves the belief that we must do a certain type of job, and that we must earn a certain level of income so as to afford a particular standard of living.

But is this image of ourselves a true image - is our image of ourselves who we really are, or is it simply what other people have told us we are? Perhaps it's something we've simply taken for granted, and never really thought about. But there are issues here which are fundamental to our happiness and sense of fulfilment. Might we have to lose what we think we are, and what we think we need, in order to become the person we really are? Might we have to lose the person we currently are, in order to become the person we want to be?

God wants us to be our true selves. Sometimes we can only become our true selves if we are prepared to give something up. Often, this means we need to take a risk - to leave behind the certainty of the tried and tested, in favour of something new. It might be that we have to give up something which is good in itself, in order to experience something which is better. We know that this giving up is often far from easy - to say the least!

But many have found Jesus' words to be profoundly true. By giving up their false selves, people have found their true selves. By losing their life, they have found it. By surrendering themselves to the pain of Good Friday, they have opened themselves to the possibility of Easter Day.

I wonder whether God is inviting us to run the risk of Resurrection - to lose something which appears to be important, so that we may gain our true selves?
