The work the council does and the decisions it makes affect the village environment and the wellbeing of its residents, but it is not very high profile. Meetings are held every other month, with the addition of the APM in April and the AGM in May. Extraordinary meetings can be held at any time. #### **Council News**

At the latest council meeting on 12th February, Vale councillors approved the budget for 2020/21. The budget allocates funding in three key areas:

- 1) Tackling the climate emergency a major priority for the council.
- Working towards a new Local Plan which will work to address residents' concerns about the current plan and put the climate and local sustainability at the heart of any future development.
- 3) Addressing the council's own long-term financial situation by identifying savings that have the minimum impact on residents and businesses, as well as identifying opportunities to generate additional income.

Additionally, the Council voted to approve changes to the Council Tax Reduction Scheme, effective from 1st April 2020, which will see more than 430 people on low income in the Vale of White Horse receive additional support to help them pay their council tax. You can find out more about the Council Tax Reduction Scheme by visiting whitehorsedc.gov.uk/ctrs. Cont.

The Vale of White Horse District Council's Climate Emergency Advisory Committee (CEAC) met on 28th January to recommend new schemes for the council to tackle climate change. The committee recommended a one-year programme of actions to begin the journey to a carbon neutral council by 2030 and a carbon neutral district by 2045. The programme included, amongst other things: identifying opportunities for investment in solar energy, working with interested community action groups and conducting a feasibility study into increasing biodiversity and tree planting. The report also looked at how the council could develop a green travel plan for officers and members, create an action plan to reduce single-use plastic and help to promote healthier lifestyle choices such as walking and cycling to reduce vehicle emissions. #### Didcot Garden Town Project

A new governance structure for the Didcot Garden Town project has been approved, which includes the launch of three new 'sounding boards' - one for local parishes, one for businesses based in the area and one for community representatives. The council will be inviting parish and town councils located within Didcot Garden Town and the wider Area of Influence (this includes Upton) to participate. All the advisory board and sounding board meetings are set to be open for residents to attend. The government also announced on 14th January that South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse District Councils will be receiving £100,000 to help support Didcot Garden Town, which the Advisory Board have discussed spending on projects that will help to improve sustainability and connections in the town and highlight smart technology.

# **Wine Club**

This February we asked some of our members to present a wine of their choice (along with the odd story). Whilst we may all have our wines we love and those we don't love so much, the one thing that unites us all is that there is always a story behind some of our most memorable wine moments. That's one of the reasons we all enjoy coming to the club each month!

To start, Ian reminded us that knowing just a little bit about where our wines are from can be very beneficial by letting us try a Sauvignon Blanc from the Loire region in France. From the Upper area we tried a well known SB from Sancerre and compared this with a SB from the Middle region of Touraine. At nearly half the price of the Sancerre, any wine from Touraine is worth a go as a good alternative.

Our newest member of the committee, Natalie spoke fondly of a wine from Greece, Assyrtiko which was a reminder of the wine served at her wedding reception, which was held next to a winery in Santorini. A wine not many had tasted and well worth a try.

Brian spoke about an amazing women called Samantha O'Keefe, who single handily set up a winery in South Africa on the Lismore Estate, with no previous experience. Along with bringing up two small children, she managed to produce some of the highest rated wines by the worlds most notable wine tasters, only to have it all brought down around her by a fire that took away her vines and also her house. Undeterred, she is selling the last few remaining wines and starting again. You will not be able to try her new wines for another 2 years but there are still some left from the last harvest! We tried the Viognier but they are all good and available at strictlywine.com.

Paul took us through the last of the whites, which he tried presenting a few years back but was unable to find a wine from Lanzarote to present. You would not think vines could grow in volcanic soils with not much more than a few inches of rain each year but this was an experience for us all. Look out for El Grifo, which was a very refreshing drink.

We had three reds to finish. Derek took us through two wines. The first was a red from Austria. Not a normal part of the world to find a red due to the cooler climate. The grape variety called Zweigelt produced a light (9.5% vol) wine that was labelled a picnic wine. To finish we were treated to a wine he had bought 8 years ago and laid down in temperature controlled storage. Bought at just over £10 and now worth over £20, the Chateau Beaumont, Haut-Medoc, 2009 was a real treat.

In between these wines Simon talked mainly about a bit of a road trip in Georgia he had been on where he came across various wineries. We tasted a bottle which was made from 100% Saperavi grape. Another excellent wine 'and equally good story!

It was great to hear everyone talk about their experiences with wine, thanks to everyone who contributed! Next month, we have a real treat with two guys who supply wines to Strictlywine "pitching" for our vote as they present wines from various countries from around the world - all related to the Rugby Six Nations (both current and potential future participants!)

# **Blewbury Post Office**



# Standing on a Bridge

Do you like going for a walk in the countryside? We are fortunate to live in an area where there are so many walks to choose from. One of my personal favourites is the short walk from East Hagbourne to West Hagbourne, along the path which avoids the main road. A few hundred yards or so from the church, there is a bridge

where the path crosses a small stream, and on this bridge is a plaque with two words written on it. It's a lovely spot to pause and enjoy the countryside all around.

You're probably wondering what the words are, and why I have chosen to write about them. The words are "Release" and "Peace". And why have I chosen to write about them?

Well, it's all about Lent - the forty-day period before Easter, during which Christians try to learn more about their faith and become better followers of Jesus. The words "Release" and "Peace" seem to me to be particularly appropriate to the keeping of Lent. Lent is about intentionally getting rid of all the stuff which prevents us from knowing the love of God in all its fullness and gets in the way of sharing that love effectively with all neighbours and our world. We need to be "released" from selfishness, greed, fear, and so much more besides. We need to change our lives so that we can receive God's gift of peace - that gift of God's peace which enables us to feel at peace with ourselves and our world.

I wonder what you and I need to do to be "released" from all the stuff which is getting in the way of our flourishing as human beings? What do you and I need to do to receive God's gift of Peace in all its fullness?

Perhaps we just need to calm down a bit, to give ourselves more time simply to be. Perhaps we need to spend more time with friends and family. Perhaps we need to try and mend broken relationships.

And perhaps we need to be more intentional about spending some time with God. Which brings us back to walks in the countryside. Many people find that going for a walk is an ideal way of reconnecting with our true selves - and when we reconnect with our true selves, we can reconnect with God. I wonder what you and I will discover, on our next walk in the countryside?
